Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Singer thanked everyone for participating. Commissioner Rose acknowledged the upcoming restrictions regarding COVID. He thought it was nice that Christmas lights are appearing earlier this year.

Poulsbo Boaters Association

The association gave their report.

Old Business Items

Breakwater & Boat Ramp Updates

Mr. Piccone gave his presentation. He said, regarding the breakwater, the Army Corps have continued to be of struggle with their responsiveness. The National Marine Fisheries has been holding up several projects throughout Puget Sound. He and Port Accountant Tripp had a phone conference with the Army Corps in late October about the breakwater and boat ramp. They were told to send emails to encourage responsiveness over the next 3-4 weeks. The next step would include another phone conference with the Army Corps in early December if they haven't moved forward with the review. The next meeting would be an escalation to more senior staff at the Seattle branch. Mr. Piccone said they're being told to put pressure on each step and escalate to higher ranks within the corps. They briefly discussed passing the

emergency permitting through the corps. Mr. Piccone believes there is justification in doing so on the boat ramp and certainly the breakwater project. It wouldn't negate the review from the corps but would allow them to do their review after the completion of the project. We aren't quite ready to make that decision yet, but it's looking likely to take that route. We will chat with the corps again mid-December and Mr. Piccone will have a report to give in the 2nd meeting in December.

Regarding the city permitting for both projects, we are over all hurdles. We are waiting on the WDFD permit, which expected December 4th. In terms of the City shoreline permit on the breakwater, the City is reviewing the project now. The public comment period can start in December. Mr. Piccone has told the City, as well as the corps, that we are focused on having permits in hand by the end of the February and proceeding with the project as scheduled. He is doing what he can to cut down the 120-day timeline. Regarding the comprehensive scheme, he has sent out a copy of draft two. Mr. Piccone encouraged having any comments submitted by December 4th. That will allow Mr. Piccone to incorporate the comments by December 11th. He suggested having an agenda item during the 2nd meeting in December to discuss public outreach.

Resolution #9 – Declaring Local Emergency & Delegation of Authority – Review Port Accountant Tripp no action was taken.

Comprehensive Scheme

Discussed in Mr. Piccone's report.

Security Camera Update

Port Accountant Tripp completed a basic survey that was sent to every tenant at the Port. *Are security cameras needed at the Port?* 64 answered yes, 58 answered no. *Would increased monthly costs for cameras create a financial hardship?* 29 answered yes, 97 answered no.

Would you like security cameras at the Port? 68 answered yes, 55 answered no.

Commissioner Rose said other Ports have security cameras and believes it would be prudent to have cameras for adequate coverage (security, weather, etc.). Commissioner Singer said if security cameras are installed, the cost should be shared equally for boaters, and not based on the length of the boat. Commission Green didn't think now would be the best time to include security cameras. She would like to see the breakwater completed first.

Disabled Veterans Program

There were no updates at this time. Commissioner Rose would like to have a chat with Pam and garner other participants who may be interested in putting a concept together and figuring a phased plan. He's planning on having an update at the second meeting in December.

Maintenance has been working on the monthly checklist. No boats dragging anchor in or near our perimeter. Still receiving fair amount of calls about the sailboat on Lemolo Shore.

During my daily walks of the docks, these last several storms everyone's vessels have been pretty secure, only had to adjust a few lines and a couple of bumpers. There are still a handful of the same dinghies and canoes that we are contacting to have them pumped out. Just wanted to remind them if maintenance has to pump out these vessels its \$50 per man hour w 1 hour minimum. So please when you see how the weather has been and delivered please be proactive and pump them out. If you were to put them aboard your vessel or upland then that would elevate the task of repeated pumping out and our phone calls during the fall/winter months.

Permanent moorage is at 95% occupancy, and currently we have 23 winter moorage vessels.

Sent in the annual pumpout gallonage report and request for reimbursement for parts. (\$1,174.87)

Usage up - Fuel dock pumpout gallons almost 73k gallons - C dock 13k gallons

The increase is more than likely because the free pumpout service boat is no longer & since Covid more boats coming into our marina more frequently since they cant travel to other neighboring countries for their trips.

Have been researching on inspections in surrounding marina throughout Puget Sound and up to Port Angeles. Kingston has been the only marina thus far that has a few more items they conduct on their inspections. Bremerton, Liberty bay, Brownsville, John Wayne in PA, Olympia/Swantown, Elliot Bay, Roach Harbor either do not conduct safety inspections, or only does a visual inspection, and others does minimal only operability and electrical.

I talked with maintenance staff and we have agreed on some of the items that would be helpful to add to our checklist. So I'll be revamping our operations inspection checklist and start implementing first of the year.

Wanted to bring up the re inspection of vessels in our marina and the registration tabs. Right now there is 5 vessels with no current registrations tabs. 1 because they are in a home and their relatives are having a hard time traveling during covid to get power of attorney to update his registration. Another has paid for it back in May but never received in mail and hasn't taken the time to check on where they are, 2 of them just haven't put them on their vessel, and the last one I haven't heard back from him. Would like to remind the board that people have become very creative with the posting of their tabs. Sometimes you literally have to look all over the boat. I have found them in normal area near the WN's, in their front or side window, on the base of their mast, in plastic cover on their bow rail. Also some of the vessels that are documented will not display tabs per RCW 88.02.550 as long as they have the registration with their documented certificate aboard to show when asked.

While walking docks I have updated my list from a couple months ago with vessels in need of reinspection. Carol and I spoke about how far back we should go from the vessels last inspection. Keeping in mind the last ALL marina inspection was conducted in mid 2014 finished in early 2015. It was decided to re inspect vessels of concern that have not been inspected within four years. My list has 38 questionable vessels and 22 have not been inspected for over 4 years. So, I will be sending out letters explaining purpose for inspections and to set up date & time for inspections.

Troller Point Fisheries/Ocean Oasis will be in Marina on D dock on November 29th - Dec. 1st.
