Breakwater & Boat Ramp Updates

There are no new updates. Port Accountant Tripp said the Port is still waiting to hear from Army Corps. The Port of Poulsbo will be partnering with the Port of Keyport and City of Bainbridge Island to get a meeting with Derek Kilmer to see if they can't assist us in finding out where our permit is with Army Corps. John Piccone will be attending a meeting (or issuing a Memo) soon. We should be hearing back on the federal grant for \$1.04 million within the next 60 days.

New Business Items

Items for Public Comments/Discussion

Discussion on Future Meetings and Current Needs: COVID-19

The board will continue with regularly scheduled meetings until told otherwise. Commissioner DeSalvo recognized the public needs to have a forum to listen in on the meetings. He asked Port Accountant Tripp to do some research on what might be available regarding a phone line or teleconference people can call into. Commissioner Singer said there are a lot of options and the board may need to pay a fee for it. Port Accountant Tripp stated Zoom software has a way to link phone numbers for people to call into meetings. Commissioner DeSalvo asked that people continue sending in comments via email or the mail and they'll be read aloud for the record. Next, Commissioner DeSalvo said unless there is a dire need to review policies, all current policies will stay in affect, as written, unless there's a problem with them. We will limit the amount of time involved with the regularly scheduled meetings. Any policies that are up for review will be postponed for the next month and removed from the agenda.

Commissioner DeSalvo stated the safety and welfare of our employees and tenants is a priority. The Port can lead, protect, and provide a public benefit at the Port. Boats are a good way to remain isolated. If people choose to self-isolate during this time, the board requests (not require) boat owners show some form of indication of self-isolation (i.e.: red plastic tied to the banister) so everyone can respect appropriate distance and space.

To respect social distancing, the board requests phone calls, emails, or text messages as primary forms of communication, whenever possible. The Port of Poulsbo is following guidance from the County and the State. If people are isolating, please let the Port know and we will respect it. Please do not walk into the Port office if you can communicate via phone, email, or text. Limit your exposure to other people. Once the Port is on the upswing from all this, it'll be time to figure out how to start the economic part of the business. For now, the Port is operating on the safety part of business.

Commissioner Green recommended verifying all bleach within the Port is not expired. It was confirmed that all bleach products are within their use-by date and extra cleaning is taking place at the Port of Poulsbo.

PORT OF POULSBO RESOLUTION NO. 09 DECLARING LOCAL EMERGENCY AND DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

RECITALS

- **WHEREAS**, novel Coronavirus COVID-19, a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death, is caused by a new strain of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and has proven it can easily spread from person to person; and,
- **WHEREAS**, the U.S. Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has identified a potential public health threat posed by COVID-19 both globally and within the United States, including within Washington State; and,
- **WHEREAS**, there are documented cases of COVID-19, including deaths caused thereby, within Washington State; and,
- WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Health has confirmed the person-toperson spread of COVID-19 and is finding an increasing risk of exposure and infection to the general public due to its potential to spread quickly; and,
- **WHEREAS**, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency for COVID-19 on January 31, 2020; and,
- WHEREAS, Washington State Governor Jay Inslee proclaimed a public health emergency for COVID-19 on February 29, 2020; and,
- WHEREAS, on March 8, 2020, the Kitsap County Board of Commissioners declared a Public Health Emergency in response to COVID-19; and,
- **WHEREAS**, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a global pandemic on March 11, 2020; and,
- **WHEREAS**, the President of the United States declared public national emergency relating to COVID-19 on March 13, 2020; and,
- WHEREAS, the Port cannot assure that it can maintain an orderly Port Commission meeting and protect the public health and safety by maintaining social distancing during a Port Commission meeting given the uncertainty as to the number of members of the public who may seek to attend a Port Commission meeting in person and the limited size of the Port's meeting facility; and
- WHEREAS, the Commission finds that the Port Manager may need to take such additional action, including, by example, matters relating to human resources, leases, and marina issues, to quickly address this emergency situation, and that this resolution is intended to authorize the Port Manager to take such emergency actions as needed to address this emergency provided the Port Manager notifies the Commission and seeks Commission ratification and confirmation as soon as practicable; and,
 - WHEREAS, there is an emergency present which necessitates this Resolution.

WHEREAS, this Resolution was considered at a regular meeting of the Port Commission on March 20th, 2020 at 7:00pm.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT DECLARED BY THE COMMISSION OF THE PORT OF POULSBO:

- 1. **Proclamation**. The Commission of the Port of Poulsbo ("District") hereby and expressly finds and declares, based upon the Recitals above, which are expressly adopted herein, that COVID-19 is a civil public health emergency that:
 - A. Demands immediate action to preserve public health, protect life, protect public property, or to provide relief to any stricken neighborhood overtaken by such occurrences; and
 - B. Could, if unattended, seriously affect the safety, health, or welfare of a substantial number of citizens of the Port's district, or preclude the operation or use of essential public services and facilities with such magnitude or severity as to necessitate seeking state, county, or other supplementation of local efforts or resources exerted or utilized in alleviating the danger, damage, suffering or hardship faced.
- 2. **Authority**. This Resolution Declaring a Local Emergency ("Resolution") authorizes the Port Manager to exercise such emergency powers as may be lawful under applicable laws, regulations, ordinances, or the District's policies, and necessary, including by way of example and not limitation: general port powers under Title 53, RCW, RCW 53.12.270 (Delegation of powers to managing official), RCW 39.04.280(3) for emergency procurement, and Chapter 39. 28 RCW (Emergency Public Works). Effective upon signature hereto and as further detailed in Section 3 below, the Port Manager is authorized to exercise such lawful authority through the use and direction of District personnel, services, equipment and such additional acts as the Port Manager may find necessary in his or her sole discretion to properly and safely manage this emergency.
- 3. **Powers**. In order to properly delegate and authorize the Port Manager to prepare for, address, manage, prevent, respond to, and remediate this emergency situation, the Port Manager shall have all necessary powers to do the following, which is provided for example and not limitation: Make necessary rules and regulations reasonably related to the emergency, to obtain supplies, equipment, personal property, professional, procured or technical services, etc. (including selecting and awarding such contracts as necessary), such public works as defined by RCW 39.04.010, to authorize overtime and/or extended leave for personnel, to requisition personnel and material, obtain emergency funding and permitting through federal, state and local agencies, amend leases or agreements to respond to this emergency, and take such other lawful acts, as may be necessary and reasonably related to respond to the emergency declared hereunder. Specifically, and without limiting the forgoing, the Commission waives the competitive solicitation process(es) for purchase of goods and services, including personal services, where deemed required by the Port Manager, or her designee, in response to the health concern of COVID-19, as allowed by law, and pursuant to the terms of this Resolution.
- 3.1 The foregoing powers and authorities are to be read consistent with the District's existing Delegation of Authority- Resolution No. 2013-07, as amended; however, if there is a conflict between the Delegation of Authority- Resolution No. 2013-07, as amended and this Resolution, this Resolution shall control.

- 3.2 If the Port Manager exercises any powers or authorities delegated under this Resolution, the Port Manager shall report such exercise to the Commission at the next regular Commission meeting with explanation as to why it was necessary to take such action under this Resolution to meet the emergency situation articulated herein.
- 3.3 At each regular Commission meeting, the Commission shall take such action in an open session to ratify, modify or rescind the Port Manager's action(s) hereunder.
- 4. **Port Commission Meetings**. Pursuant to RCW 42.30, and in particular RCW 42.30.050 and RCW 42.30.070, the Port Commission determines that an emergency exists and that the orderly conduct of a Port Commission meeting cannot be assured while maintaining social distancing as required by federal, state and local officials, and thus will:
- (1) provide for public attendance of any regular or special Port Commission meeting via "zoom" software or similar software and/or by telephone in lieu of attendance in person,
- (2) provide space in the Port Commission meeting room for up to one (1) member of the press to attend in person determined by the first press representative to so request,
- (3) allow Port commission members to participate in the meeting by zoom and/or telephone, and
- (4) otherwise will not allow the public to attend a commission meeting in person until such time as further direction or order is taken by the commission or the Port Manager.

Further, that the Port Commission meeting agenda shall include information as to how members of the public can attend a Port Commission meeting by "zoom" software or similar software and/or by telephone.

- 5. **Payment of Port Obligations**. The Commission authorizes the Port Manager to approve the payment of expenses, claims or other obligations of the Port, which are payable out of solvent funds, and all such disbursements therefrom shall be by check of the Port Auditor, provided however the Commission shall be provided, electronic or otherwise, with a list of all such payments made.
- 6. **Termination**. This Resolution shall continue in full force and effect until terminated by law or by further Resolution and shall be reviewed as a regular agenda item on the Commission's agenda until such time as this Resolution is terminated.

7. General Provisions:

- A. The Recitals set forth above are expressly adopted herein
- B. This Resolution and this Proclamation shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of budgetary appropriations.
- C. This Resolution and the Proclamation is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the Port of Poulsbo, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.

- D. The Port Commission further reserves its rights to issue such further orders as may be necessary to respond to the state of emergency declared by Kitsap County, the State of Washington, or the United States in response to COVID-19.
- E. This resolution shall be in effect from March 20, 2020 until such time as rescinded by action of the Commission.



Who cares? Do the commissioners care? Does everyone care only about the Port's income and I don't matter?

First,

Thank you to all that you do to make the Port of Poulsbo Marina a great place to be. I do have some concerns and recommendations as mentioned in the subject line.

-Sanitation. Obviously with the current situation we are dealing with regarding COVID-19, sanitation and not spreading germs is paramount. We do have a restroom/showers that we use as members. I would like to know if there has been any sort of increase in the amount of times these facilities have been cleaned, and if they are being more closely monitored. I also think that these should be very restrictive on who can utilize the facilities. I believe it should be for paying members only. I have been told, and I do not know if totally true, that if anyone anchors out in Liberty Bay, paying customer or not, they have access to these facilities.

With the recent loss of the free pump out service, and the cost of receiving this service, there is the option to use the carts to pump out our own tanks. I have been told that the carts themselves are not in the greatest shape to include cleanliness. I also don't exactly know where they are located or how many we have. I know I can simply call and ask, but if I don't know, maybe others do not and perhaps it could be publicized maybe a little better. I am curious if there will ever be a system like Brownsville Marina where there is a connection next to the slips with a common drain system? I am concerned as well about the spread of germs using these portable tanks. Are they cleaned at all?

Video monitoring. I had brought up in a PBO Boating meeting we had about a month ago that a webcam installed in a few areas around the port would be of great benefit for folks to be able to not only view their boats from their own homes, but also for safety and security issues. It would be great to be able to simply log in to your home computer or cell phone and see the status of your boat and make sure the rain, wind, or snow is not affecting them in a negative way.

I read in the paper about the horrible incident with one of our tenants drowning last week. I can't help but wonder if there had been a simple video camera with the wifi we have, looking over that way, would someone maybe have even perhaps saw something to help. I don't know the variables of this man's death, but I wonder. I also have not heard or seen any communication from the Port of Poulsbo Marina as a tenant myself, regarding any of that very unfortunate event.

There are some dingy's next to some of our boats that are nearly half full of water and they are requiring continued addressing to the boat owner to make sure they are not going to sink. That is also a safety issue.

I thank you the staff for all that you do for us, I really do appreciate having my boat at our awesome marina. These are some of my personal concerns and recommendations.
