**Call to Order 7:00 pm**

**Executive Session**

The board began the meeting by going into a 30-minute executive session to discuss with legal counsel a potential litigation per RCW 42.30.110 paragraph one, section liii.

**Recess to Executive Session at 7:01 pm**

**Commissioner Rose reconvened from Executive Session to Regular Meeting at 7:30 pm**

**Commissioner Comments**

Commissioner Green attended a couple of City meetings (economic development, and business recovery). Construction is starting to take place around town. The chamber is hosting a golf tournament in June, the date is TBD. She heard they might cancel it, but she is still seeing advertisements for the event. Viking Fest is scheduled for May and still accepting parade application. There will be a street dance Saturday night of Viking Fest. The Boardwalk along the waterfront is closed for the summer and in need of serious repair. The Farmers Market has begun.

Commissioner Singer said it's good to know what the City is doing. There has been a lot of activity at the Port. Several people are already coming down to the docks. He is looking forward to seeing the kayak thing complete and has received a lot of mail about it. He said another great summer is coming.

Commissioner Rose wanted to officially recognize Chris tonight and talk to Port Accountant Tripp privately about how the board can provide recognition for his life saving efforts. Chris went above and beyond, and that attests to his availability and diligence. Saving a life is a high calling and impressive. It looks like the Port is finding footing together and how we can get out and monitor the harbor. He feels encouraged and thanks the City for any of their involvement.

**Public Comments**

Councilman Musgrove said the City is still moving forward to allow the Farmers Market to occupy the current Public Works site by the Library. It'll take well over a year before the transition to take place, if it does. He already found out about the training programs from the police department. The fire department has a boat, but no one qualified to operate it.

Port Accountant Tripp said products are being ordered. She will have a bid package for the fire line available at the next meeting and will provide more information at that time. Everything is moving along.

**Hot Berth & Permanent Moorage Waitlist**

Port Accountant Tripp said the proposed changes in the waitlist are about a new Washington State law. There are new requirements including current photos of all sides of the vessel, the current location of where the boat is moored, a current copy of registration, and the declarations page from insurance. In addition to that, she believes it would make sense to be

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particular of the new vessels coming in, and any vessel older than 30 years old should provide a current marine survey dated within 18 months of the application.

After brief discussion the commissioners agreed that any vessels built before 1992 will be required to provide a current marine survey initiated by the current owner within the last four years. Port Accountant Tripp will make the adjustments and bring the updated waitlist policy to the next meeting for approval.

Port Accountant Tripp has done a lot of research on hot berthing and investigated what other ports are doing. The port marinas with 30+ staff members can easily make the time for the work involved in hot berthing. She understands people want to do it, but she has a lot of struggles with the topic. It's a cumbersome, time-consuming process (paperwork, deposits, meters, inspections, etc.), and not user friendly for the licensees, or the limited number of Port staff employees.

**Public Comments/Request for Future Agenda Items**

Pam would like to hear the commission discuss boathouse float upgrading if the Port is concerned about the health of Liberty Bay.

Councilman Musgrove heard of a system in Florida where some sort of approved method of bagging was used as a much lower cost solution for the barrier on Styrofoam.

**Commissioner Comments**

Commissioner Green said to enjoy the water and be safe.

Commissioner Singer clarified that boathouses are required to refloat by the buyer if they are sold.

Commissioner Rose said he had a good exchange with Puget Sound Keeper. They're proactive and have been out before; they were heartened to hear about the breakwater plans. They do sampling and surveillance, which is another leg to improved presence on the water. He will get back with them and see how they can connect with staff. He welcomes their participation at the Port. Presence and education on the water are important and Puget Sound Keeper has a lot of resources and ideas for grants.

- **Maintenance Report – Eugene Madayag**

Maintenance in progress or completed for the month of March and April to date:

- Approximately 90% of the old fire line has been removed from AA, A, B, C and X Dock has been removed.
- Prepping of all the blocking and boards for the new railing to be installed for the fire line is in progress.
- Work skiff has been returned with new bottom paint.

Maintenance to be Scheduled:

- Kayak racks pushed back until old fire line tore out and bull rail reinforced.
- Concrete spalling throughout all docks (spring).
- Will be rewiring seaplane dock lights and lowering light poles to better suit sea plane wings.

- **Permanent Moorage Report – Melanie Winnett**

There was a small spill from a Boathouse owner which was caused by an old container, cracking and leaking fuel additive. Please take a moment to check your vessel or boathouse to verify that you do not have any old containers that are old/brittle and could cause a spill. Remember to store these types of items properly, whether in a hazmat locker or in a spill/waterproof container. If there is interest for another 'Marina Hazmat Day,' it can be arranged for this summer.

I have been working with Carol to update the website. We have plans to update the 'derelict vessel page' to include links to report sewage spills and various other reporting agencies to report concerns.

I have been researching a place to get specialized training for on water rescues since we have had 2 individuals fall into the water within the last 2 weeks.

A reminder that winter moorage ends at the end of April.

- **Guest Moorage Report – Jannese Hunt**

Guest Moorage has been seeing an increase in reservations for the upcoming season. And there are yacht clubs calling each week looking for times for rendezvous.

We have two cleaning and beautification projects planned for the coming weeks based on weather and staffing: the Jensen way parking lot, and E/F dock pressure washing/scrubbing. The Jensen lot will take 3 to 4 days to week, trim bushes, blackberries, and vines. The asphalt will also be swept using the Goat. E/F dock will likely take 3 days. Guest moorage will use the pressure washer to scrub the docks, and to clean the MPR and under the ramp.

All guest moorage personnel are now up to date with CPR, First aid and AED.

This Weekend we have Roche Harbor Yacht Club's rendezvous. They have 30 boats participating in this rendezvous.

We have been meeting with the chamber of commerce about Easter, Viking Fest, 4<sup>th</sup> of July, Halloween, and Julefest. Easter we will decorate the port truck and have the "candy shoot" again. This was very well received and has been requested. Viking Fest is expected to be very well attended. There will be a street dance after the parade, and we were advised by the Chamber and Poulsbo PD that there will likely be large crowds.

We have secured security for the Street Dance for the hours of 5:00 – 11:00pm.

Guest moorage is also involved with "girls' night" in Poulsbo. Jannese and Brian will be placing the signs for the event.

#### Accounting & Manager Report –

There was a joint meeting with Poulsbo Police and Poulsbo Fire. Several topics were discussed during the meeting. The police boat is now back in the water after extensive repairs to their vessel. The Fire Department will be getting staff members certified to provide CPR, First Aid and AED training in the future for the Port. It was decided to have monthly joint meeting during the busy summer months then quarterly meetings in the winter.

Western Washington University has made its final proposal for use of office space in the Sea Discovery Center. WWU will provide the Port with a single large office (18.5' x 18.5') for a reduced rate of \$500 per month and no fees for the WWU floating lab. The proposed move in date is May 1<sup>st</sup>. The rental agreement is still being drafted by WWU and will be forwarded to the Commission as soon as it is received.

Kris Goodfellow contacted me with some brief updates on the sailing team plans. They have a good lead on a Sailing Team Coach and are continuing to move forward with replacement plans for the docks.

We continue to have issues with a handful of vessels which are anchored out in the bay. Last week there was a serious altercation between a permanent moorage licensee and 2 individuals anchored out in bay. This happened during the day and the Poulsbo police department was called.

Unfortunately, we had to call the Poulsbo police department to do a water rescue this weekend. Thankfully Sebastian from Freedom Boat Club was able to assist the boater before the PD arrived. Please remember to always wear a PFD when out on your vessel!

The weather is getting nice, and we have seen an uptick in business. Please remember that the Port of Poulsbo has limited parking availability. Remember to use your parking permit when visiting your vessel and clearly display the parking permit. We have had several parking violations within the last few weeks and want to ensure that our boaters have access to these limited spots. We will begin to vigorously tow vehicles that do not display a valid parking permit.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners recognizes that the Port of Poulsbo has adopted a reserve policy; and

**WHEREAS**, the Port Accountant has reported that the annual revenue for the year ending December 31, 2021 totals \$2,748,129.27, with \$2,291,440.40 coming from General revenues and \$456,688.87 coming from Liberty Park revenues; and

**WHEREAS**, the reserve policy states that the initial minimum contribution into the Contingency Reserve Fund is to be 2% of the annual revenue.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Port of Poulsbo, Kitsap County, Washington that the Port Accountant complete an Interfund Transfer in the amount of \$45,282.81 from the General Fund into the Contingency Reserve Fund and \$9,133.78 from the Liberty Park Fund into the Contingency Reserve Fund.


