MARINERS UPDATE

WINTER WEATHER IS ON THE WAY

AS WINTER WEATHER APPROACHES, THE PORT OF POULSBO ENCOURAGES ALL BOATERS TO TAKE A FEW SIMPLE PRECAUTIONS TO KEEP YOUR VESSELS SAFE AND SECURE THROUGHOUT THE SEASON. PLEASE DOUBLE-CHECK YOUR MOORAGE LINES FOR WEAR, ADD CHAFE PROTECTION WHERE NEEDED, AND ENSURE FENDERS ARE PROPERLY PLACED FOR SHIFTING TIDES AND WIND. WINTER STORMS CAN ARRIVE QUICKLY, SO TAKING A MOMENT NOW TO PREPARE YOUR BOAT HELPS PROTECT BOTH YOUR VESSEL AND YOUR NEIGHBORS ON THE DOCKS. IF YOU HAVE ANY CONCERNS OR NEED ASSISTANCE, OUR MARINA STAFF IS HERE TO HELP. OUR STAFF CONDUCT STORM WALK-THROUGHS AND ARE ALWAYS HERE TO HELP-JUST LET US KNOW IF YOU'RE A VISITING GUEST NEEDING AN EXTRA SET OF EYES.


SERVING THE POULSBO BOATING COMMUNITY

THE PORT COMMISSIONERS AND THE POULSBO CITY COUNCIL CONDUCTED A FALL PORT COMMISSIONER-CITY COUNCIL JOINT MEETING AT CITY HALL ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2025. ISSUES AND ITEMS OF MUTURAL INTEREST WERE DISCUSSED SUCH AS DERELICT VESSELS, WATERFRONT PARKING, PUBLIC PARK PROJECTS, AND EFFORTS TO WORK COLLABORATIVELY ON FUTURE EFFORTS THAT BENEFIT THE COMMUNITY. THE MEETING WAS VERY PRODUCTIVE AND ANOTHER JOINT CITY / PORT MEETING WAS PLANNED FOR NEXT MARCH OF 2026.

CITY COUNCIL IMPLEMENTS PARKING TIME LIMITS FOR FREE WATERFRONT PARKING ON NOVEMBER 1, 2025

STARTING NOVEMBER 1, VISITORS TO FRONT STREET AND SURROUNDING AREAS OF DOWNTOWN WILL NOW BE SUBJECT TO WARNINGS AND EVENTUALLY FINES FOR EXCEEDING THE POSTED TIME LIMITS IN PARKING AREAS. THE PORT CONTINUES ADVOCATING FOR BALANCED PARKING SOLUTIONS THAT PRESERVE ACCESS FOR VISITING BOATERS AND WATERFRONT BUSINESSES.

AMERICAN CRUISE LINES VISITS PORT OF POULSBO


THE PORT OF POULSBO WELCOMED THE 278' CRUISE SHIP, THE AMERICAN CONSTELLATION ON TUESDAY, OCT. 28 AS PART OF AN EXPLORATORY VISIT BY AMERICAN CRUISE LINES.

THE VISIT TO THE RECENTLY UPGRADED POULSBO **MARINA** BREAKWATER WAS THE FIRST STEP INVESTIGATE ESTABLISHING POULSBO AS THE POSSIBLE NEWEST PORT OF CALL IN ITS PUGET SOUND CRUISING ITINERARY. THIS EXPLORATION **UNDERSCORES** POULSBO'S GROWING REPUTATION AS A WELCOMING, WORLD-CLASS BOATER DESTINATION.

CRUISING PUGET SOUND ON THE BLACK COVE 41 KEEPS HIM CLOSELY CONNECTED TO THE EVERYDAY EXPERIENCES OF BOATERS WHO RELY ON THE PORT.

BOATER SPOTLIGHT

VALKYRIE: THE VIKING BOAT & THE FAMILY THAT BROUGHT HER TO LIFE



VALKYRIE, POULSBO'S REMARKABLE 56-FOOT VIKING LONGSHIP, HAS QUICKLY BECOME ONE OF LIBERTY BAY'S MOST CAPTIVATING SIGHTS

AN AUTHENTIC, HAND-CRAFTED VESSEL BUILT BY ERIK KNUDSEN AND HIS FAMILY TO HONOR THEIR NORWEGIAN HERITAGE WHILE SHARING THE DEEPER, HUMAN SIDE OF VIKING CULTURE. INSPIRED BY AN ANCIENT DANISH LONGSHIP DESIGN, THE KNUDSEN FAMILY SPENT YEARS CONSTRUCTING VALKYRIE USING TRADITIONAL METHODS, RARE WOODS, AND THE COLLECTIVE SKILLS OF A COMMUNITY DETERMINED TO BRING A TRUE VIKING-ERA SHIP BACK TO LIFE. DRAWING FROM MULTIGENERATIONAL MARITIME ROOTS, ERIK HAS DESCRIBED THE PROJECT AS BOTH A TRIBUTE TO HIS ANCESTORS AND A BRIDGE CONNECTING MODERN NORTHWEST RESIDENTS WITH THE CRAFTSMANSHIP, SEAMANSHIP, AND COLLABORATIVE SPIRIT THAT DEFINED THE NORSE WORLD. THEIR GUIDING

PHILOSOPHY FOR THE VESSEL—JOY, EXPLORATION, CELEBRATION OF CULTURE AND COMMUNITY SHAPES EVERY ASPECT OF THE VESSEL'S MISSION.

SEASONALLY BERTHED EACH SUMMER AT THE PORT OF POULSBO, VALKYRIE IS POISED TO BECOME A CULTURAL AND TOURISM CENTERPIECE FOR THE COMMUNITY. THE ORGANIZATION IS LAUNCHING AN EXPANDING MENU OF PUBLIC OFFERINGS, INCLUDING CHARTER SAILINGS ON LIBERTY BAY, EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS FOR SCHOOLS, AND DOCKSIDE TOURS WHERE VISITORS CAN STEP ONTO THE CURVED DECK, EXAMINE THE HANDCRAFTED RIGGING, AND LEARN THE STORIES BEHIND THE SHIP'S CREATION.

PLANS ALSO INCLUDE GUEST-SPEAKER EVENTS AND PARTICIPATION IN MAJOR WATERFRONT FESTIVALS LIKE THE LIBERTY BAY FESTIVAL IN MAY 2026. WORKING CLOSELY WITH THE PORT OF POULSBO, ERIK ENVISIONS VALKYRIE AS A LIVING MUSEUM—A PLACE WHERE LOCALS, TOURISTS, AND MARITIME ENTHUSIASTS ALIKE CAN EXPERIENCE AUTHENTIC VIKING HISTORY WHILE SUPPORTING A UNIQUE, FAMILY-BUILT VENTURE THAT EMBODIES POULSBO'S PROUD IDENTITY AS "LITTLE NORWAY.
