Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by Commissioner Lawrence

Commissioner Comments

Commissioners welcomed James Weaver as the new Port Manager and expressed appreciation to staff and liveboards for their support during the leadership transition.

Commissioners reflected on challenges of operating without a manager and praised staff performance.

Poulsbo Boater's Association

There was no report.

Public Comments

There was a public comment about the PBA hosting a barbecue. There were roughly 30 attendees, and everyone had a great time. There was music and people got to know each other better. There will be another barbecue on Wednesday, September 10th and the invitation was extended to the board.

There was another public comment sharing their experience with the fuel attendant. The fuel attendant knew them by name, and everything went smoothly, pleasantly, and was overall a good experience.

There was an additional public comment regarding looking back at Commissioner Green's comments over the last seven months. It's been a challenge for the Commissioners, but things have been harmonious. He's read the Port Manager's introductory letter, listened to comments, and is really looking forward to a more harmonious relationship with everybody. He then welcomed the new Port Manager.

Commissioner Responses to Public Comments/Discussions

Commissioners emphasized commitment to community events and maintaining strong communication with tenants and liveaboards.

Accounting Report

There was no report.

Draft Preliminary 2026 Budget

Port Accountant Tripp presented the draft budget:

- Revenues: Operating revenues are projected to rise by \$20,000; parking revenues are conservatively budgeted at \$30,000 despite higher collections this year. Real estate taxes remain unchanged for the first time in years.
- Expenses: Health insurance costs up \$51,000; salary and payroll tax increases noted. Minor increases in uniforms and office costs. Consultant/audit fees expected to drop by \$127,000.
- Capital Projects: \$125,000 allocated toward fuel dock inspection/haul-out (last major work in 2016 cost ~\$350,000). Full refit will span multiple years. The X-Dock project (est. \$1.1 million with ~40% grant funding) is tentatively planned for 2027 but may be delayed due to dredging, fire line repairs, and other dock needs.
- Bond Covenant Compliance: Budget projects a slim profit margin (~\$500 above the required \$86,970).
- Rate Adjustments: Discussion emphasized small, consistent annual increases ($\leq 5\%$) to avoid disruptive double-digit hikes. Commissioners noted past practices of skipping rate adjustments caused larger jumps later.

Discussion: Commissioners agreed to pursue grants more aggressively to offset future capital costs, continue cautious expense management, and maintain predictability for tenants. Final adoption scheduled after further review.

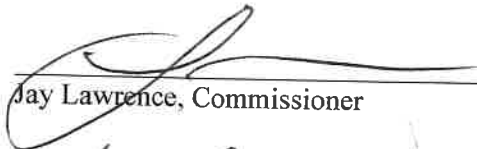
WHEREAS, funds are not currently available in full, the Port Treasurer is directed to transfer funds immediately when they become available.

Accounting Report – September 18, 2025

Accounting Report –

The Summary of Financial Statements for the month ending August 31, 2025 is attached to this report.

For the month of August, there was a net loss of <\$34,127.46>. This was due to our annual insurance payment to Enduris in the amount of \$128,501.00. There were no payouts for capital improvements made during the month. Our year-to-date net gain is \$454,052.33.

Our gas sales for the month of August increased and we now are 1.361% over the previous year. Unfortunately, diesel sales are still lagging behind the previous year and are down by 25.451%. (see attached)

Guest moorage boat nights are down by 5.25% from the previous year. Four hour stays have increased by 26.32% over the previous year and reservations have increased 65.67%. (see attached)

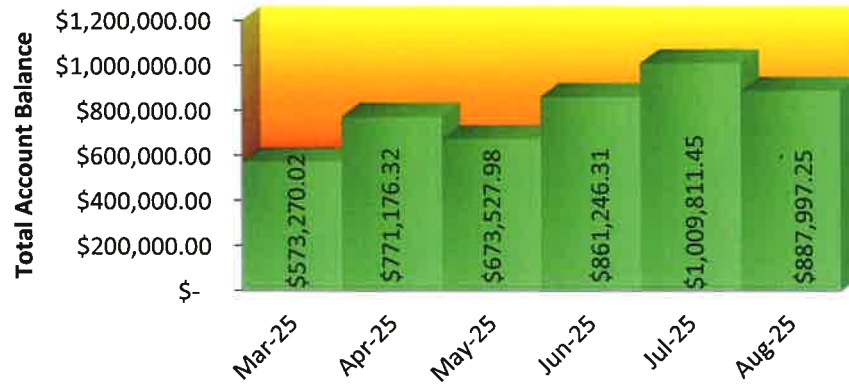

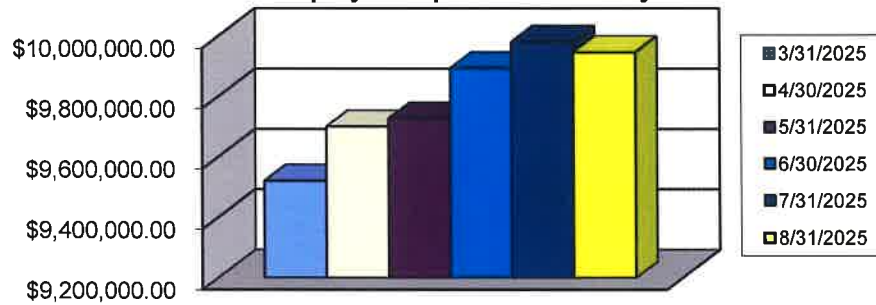

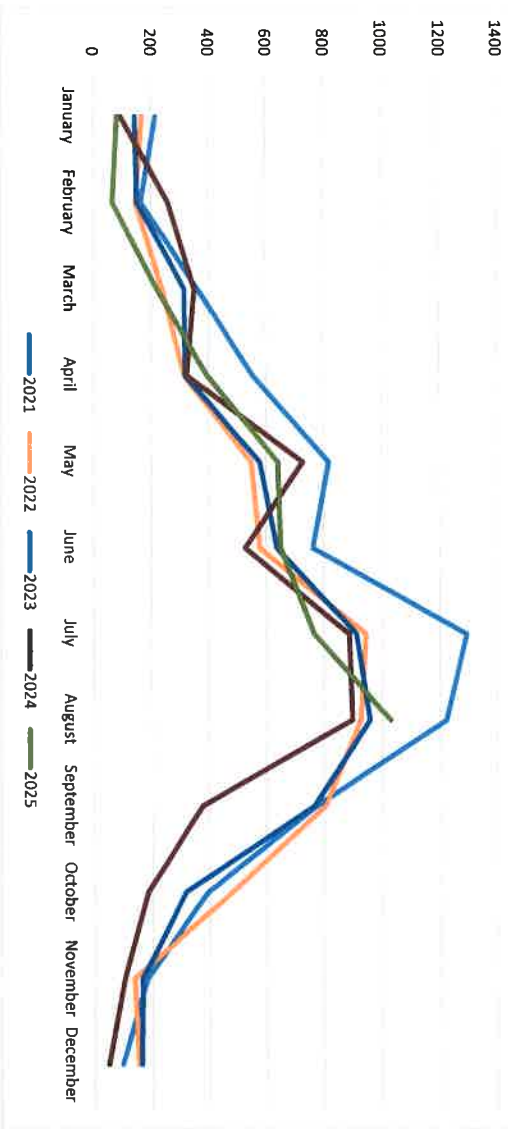

MEMORANDUM

Re: M/V Lotus Request for Reduced Moorage

The M/V Lotus is a 92' wood historic Edwardian Cruising houseboat that offers historic Tea experience, historic vessel tours, and community education. The vessel is owned by the M/V Lotus Foundation, a 501 C3 nonprofit organization.

- The owners of the vessel have requested a promotional moorage rate for September 2025 in the promotion of community education and historic tours on the vessel as an attraction.
- The vessel is intending to secure winter moorage with the Port of Poulsbo through the winter, which begins on October 1, 2025.
- More information on the vessel is available at: www.mvlotus.org

The current daily guest moorage rate is \$2 per foot per day, or \$184 daily.

The winter moorage rate for the vessel would be \$ 1,032.47 per month.

The vessel owners request was for any relief possible during September, and if the September moorage rate could be identified under the promotional rate category was desired equivalent to match the monthly winter moorage rate.

The owners presented a verbal request and Staff have conveyed this request to the best of the ability to the commissioners.

1. To sell to individuals or organizations the use, continued use, or increased use of Port on the best available terms properties, facilities, services and information useful to the Port in achieving an improvement of the Port's existing operations, facilities, and services;
2. To persuade individuals or organizations to donate, supply or sell to the Port on the best available terms properties, facilities, services and information useful to the Port in achieving an improvement of the Port's existing operations, facilities, and services;
3. To persuade individuals or organizations to purchase, lease, or contract from or with the Port on terms most favorable to the Port in order that the Port may enter into transactions for the development, improvement, or use of its properties and facilities in a manner most suitable to serve the best interests of the Port of Poulsbo; and
4. To persuade individuals or organizations to assist the Port in promoting the encouraged use of its services and facilities, by improving the scope and efficiency of Port operations so as to contribute to the direct growth of the Port's business; or by promoting goodwill regarding the Port that may reasonably lead to future business opportunities for the Port.

Non-Allowable Expenditures:

Expenditures are disallowed as follows:

1. For political purpose; or
2. For purposes not reasonably related to acquiring additional business for the Port, or otherwise increasing and improving the scope and efficiency of Port operations; or promoting the goodwill of the Port, or
3. For the promotion of transactions prohibited under Chapter 42.23 RCW.
